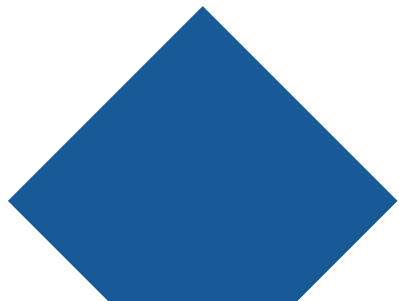

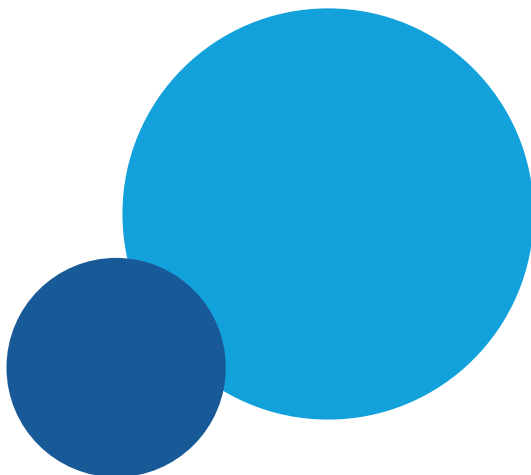

COMMITTEES & INTERNAL

STUDENT COUNCIL (FSR)

The Fachschaft refers to all students enrolled at the university. It is divided into different departments— in our case, the Department of Textile and Clothing Technology, also known as Department 07 (FB 07). Each department is represented by a Student Council (Fachschaftsrat), which is made up of dedicated students from that department and elected once a year by the student body. The role of the Student Council is to represent the specific interests of students and advocate for them within the university. We're also your go-to contact for questions, concerns, or feedback, and we always have an open ear for any issues related to university life.

FACULTY COUNCIL (FBR)

The faculty council is the highest decision-making body within the department. It makes important decisions on matters such as the course offerings, staffing, and similar issues.

Members of the FBR are:

- » The Dean serves in an advisory capacity. As the head of the department, they are elected by the professors for a term of five years.
- » The vice-dean, also in an advisory capacity
- » 6 elected professors
- » 2 employees
- » 3 students

The FBR usually meets once a month during the lecture period. Meetings are open to the public. They offer great insight into university life, the background and structure of the institution, and the politics of the department.

SENATE

The Senate plays a key role as a mediator between the different departments and between the university and the ministry.

It consists of 24 members with voting rights:

- » 12 professors
- » 8 employees
- » 4 students

The chairperson is elected from among the members of the Senate. Deans of all faculties, Vice-Deans, Chancellors, Equal Opportunities Officers and AStA chairpersons assist in an advisory capacity.

The Senate is responsible, among other things, for the following matters:

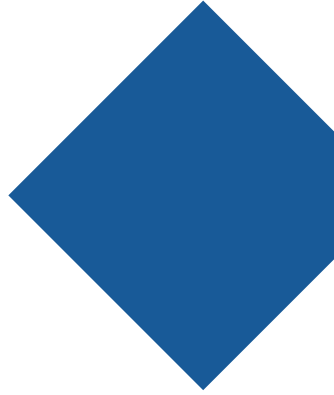
- » Confirmation of the election of Bureau members
- » Opinion on the Bureau's annual report
- » Dissemination and amendment of the university's regulations

STUDENT PARLIAMENT (STUPA)

The StuPa, or Student Parliament, is the highest body of student self-governance. Self-governance means that we, the students, take things into our own hands. Here, loans are approved, guidelines are set, and elections are organized. The parliament can have up to 31 members from the “Constituted Student Union” (i. e. all registered students of HS Niederrhein). Each department can fill one seat through a direct candidacy; most seats, however, come from various lists — also called student parties — made up of like-minded students from across the university. Anyone can start their own party and get involved. Guests are always warmly welcome at meetings.

Getting involved is definitely worth it! – No matter if FSR, stupa or FBR – but why? You have the opportunity to make a real difference at the university, for example in terms of the quality of your studies or teaching staff. In addition, your commitment to higher education policy is reflected in your CVs, letters of reference and thus in your applications. So it doesn't have to be completely selfless. Beyond that, by working together in these committees, you can not only meet new people but also develop skills like communication, teamwork, and organizational talent.

If you have special talents and can e.g. memorize the chemical formula of PET or explain the complete induction to your fellow students, then become Tutor: Commitment plus Money!

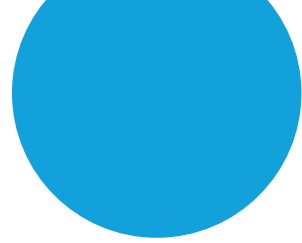

LECTURES AND INTERNSHIPS

You must register for all courses in your degree program via the online portal HiO (hio.hsnr.de), where you can also view your schedule directly. All lectures are mandatory courses, though attendance is not monitored.

It's different, however, for practical sessions. Here, your attendance and participation are checked by the professors. We strongly recommend that you always arrive on time and well-prepared for your lab sessions. If you can't make it to a session due to illness or another reason, it's usually possible to switch and attend with another group. It's important to always bring the required materials (documents, lab coat, etc.) with you.

If you miss the safety briefing, you will not be allowed to participate in further sessions. This also applies if you arrive late to the safety instruction.

ELECTIVES

During your studies, you are required to earn credit points by completing elective modules. A wide variety of electives is offered each winter and summer semester. It is recommended to begin attending these modules starting in your 3rd semester.

Details on when to take which courses can be found in the curriculum. All elective modules are listed via the following QR code:



TUTORIALS

Many students start to panic at the mere thought of so-called “difficult subjects” like math, physics, and chemistry.

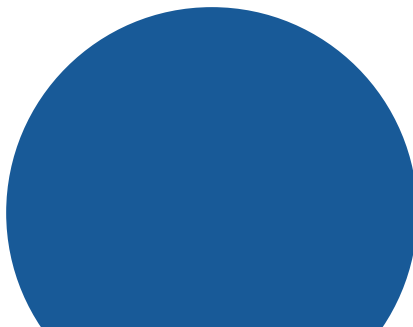
Fortunately, each semester there are some student “pros” who volunteer to go over the lecture material with the “non-pros” in tutorials — step by step, and nice and slow. For students who didn’t pass an exam, there are review sessions (called Repetitorien). Tutorials and review sessions are organized in both German and English by Ursula Korsten (ursula.korsten@hs-niederrhein.de).

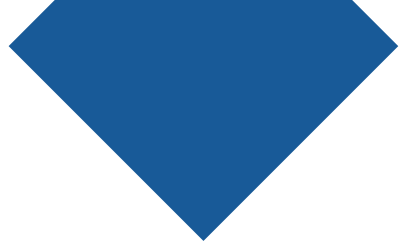
The goal is to support students in settling into university life and succeeding in their studies — through tailored offers, workshops, and one-on-one advising.

SCRIPTS

What used to be textbooks in school are now called scripts. These are usually written and provided by the professors, so you can follow along during the lectures. Notes from previous semesters — even if not officially approved by the professor — can also be helpful. However, don’t expect the scripts to replace your own note-taking. In most cases, you’ll still need to take your own notes actively.

The scripts are provided digitally by the professors.





EXAMS

The exam period in Department 07 takes place at the end of each semester and lasts for three weeks. If you achieve a grade of 4.0 or better, congratulations — you've passed! Any grade lower than that unfortunately means you have failed and must re-take the exam. You have a total of three attempts to pass. Grades can only be given in increments of .0, .3, or .7 (for example, a 1.5 is not possible — only 1.3 or 1.7). The online portal for exam registration is: hio.hsnr.de

Please check your exam registration status in the campus management system (hio.hsnr.de)! If your exam is not listed there, you are not registered. If you decide not to take an exam, you must cancel your registration through the same portal. If the cancellation period has already passed, it won't count as a failed attempt if you simply don't attend the exam. If you feel unwell during an exam, you must immediately inform the exam supervisor and see a doctor right away. Later objections will not be accepted. Late exam registrations are not allowed under any circumstances!

To prepare for exams, your own notes, lecture scripts, summaries, and past exam or practice questions are essential. Don't hesitate to ask students in higher semesters or your professors for materials. Aside from that, the golden rule is: start studying early, stock up on coffee and chocolate, and make sure to rest — and you'll get through the exam period just fine!

Important: You must bring your student ID and a valid photo ID to the exam. Phones must be turned off at all times!

TESTATE

Testate are assessments at the end of courses that do not have a written exam. The key difference is that Testate are not graded — you simply receive a “pass” or “fail.” If you fail a Testat, you can repeat it an unlimited number of times. However, there’s a catch: you usually have to retake the entire course. To pass, regular and active participation throughout the course is required.

In most cases, a testate serves as the final part of a lab or practical course. Testate can take many forms — such as written assignments, presentations, or hands-on practical work.

ONLINE PORTAL

The online student portal is managed by the university’s administration and data services. You can use it to register for exams, view your grades, or update your personal information.

How it works:

You’ll receive a letter from the university containing a numbered TAN list (60 TANs) and an initial password. Go to iman.hs-niederrhein.de/startseite.html and use the initial password to create your university account. Once your account is set up, you can log in to the student portal at hio.hsnr.de. When registering or deregistering for exams, you’ll be prompted to enter a specific TAN (e.g. No. 25). Keep this TAN list safe — you’ll need it throughout your entire studies!

Once only a few TANs remain, you should generate a new list at hio.hsnr.de using one of the remaining codes (at least two TANs are needed to generate a new list).

If you run into problems, you can contact the IT support team. But don’t worry — the process is actually quite straightforward.

EMAIL-ACCOUNT

Each student automatically receives an email address upon enrollment, using the format `firstname.lastname@stud.hn.de`. You are required to use this email address for all communication with the department and to check it at least once a week for updates and important announcements.

Important: Do not use your initial password for this email account — make sure to change it immediately!

This account is managed via the HN Identity Manager and will remain active only until your exmatriculation.

RE-REGISTRATION

Re-registration for the next semester is done by paying the semester fee.

You can find all the necessary information, including the bank details, on the online portal hio.hsnr.de under: My Studies — Student Services — Payments

STATUS SHEET

The status sheet is a personal performance overview for students. It shows which subjects or modules you have passed or failed, when you took them, and what grades you received.

Often, the first grades start appearing here during the exam period. You can find the status sheet on the homepage in the online portal.

It is not an official certificate, but it can still be used as a preliminary record for job applications — possibly with official certification from the Examination Office.



»PROBLEMS WITH PROFESSORS?«

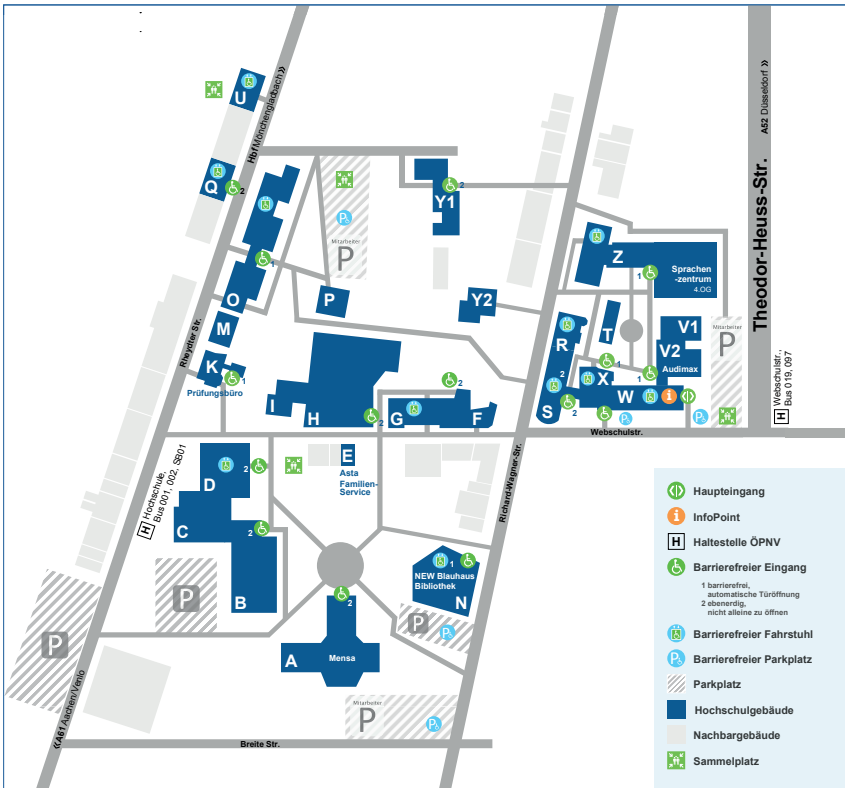
Don't worry—professors aren't monsters (at least, not usually). They're just people like you and me. And wherever there are lots of people, problems can sometimes arise. If that ever happens, stay calm! These kinds of issues are best handled calmly and rationally. So, think first, then speak.

You can talk to your trusted tutors, confidential professors, or the student council (FSR). They're there to help mediate or simply to listen. Of course, you can also go directly to your professors — ideally one-on-one, and not during or immediately after lectures! Most professors have set office hours for this purpose. It takes courage, but you can be sure you'll be taken seriously. Speaking up won't have negative consequences for you.

No matter how you choose to address the problem, remember: only those who speak up can get help! We can confidently say that at Hochschule Niederrhein, problems with professors are rare because most of them are open-minded and student-focused. In fact, the close cooperation between students and professors is one of the university's greatest strengths.

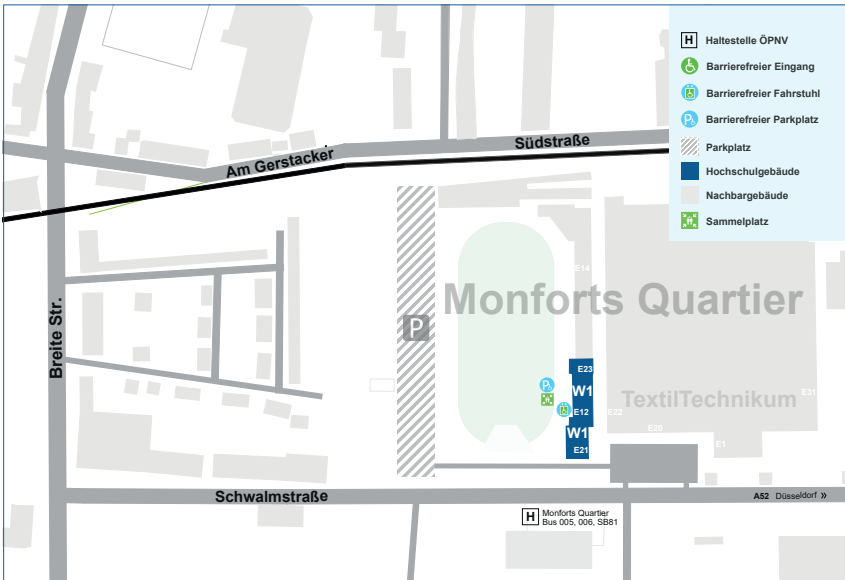
